

and his kingdom will have no end.

There will you satisfy me with yourself and fill me with such sweetness that I shall neither hunger nor thirst forevermore:

Who with God the Father and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns world without end. Amen.

## Prayer to Saint Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil.
